From 2003 to 2009 he was Chief Technical Officer of Tessera Inc., where he was a member of the management team that executed Tessera's highly successful IPO. Previously, Dr. Tuckerman was co-founder and CTO of nCHIP from 1989 through its sale to Flextronics International Ltd. in 1995. Prior to that, he managed advanced research and development projects at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory and, before that, worked for International Business Machines at its T.J. Watson Research Center and Cambridge Scientific Center.

Dr. Tuckerman received an S.B. in Physics, S.B. in Electrical Engineering, and S.M. in Electrical Engineering & Computer Science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He also holds a Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering from Stanford University, and an M.B.A. from Stanford's Graduate School of Business.

Dr. Tuckerman holds 25 U.S. patents, has authored more than 50 technical publications, and is a Fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE).
